September 2020-July 2021	Phase 2 of curriculum review Following the full re-opening of schools after lockdown staff to begin to implement the teaching of the revised curriculum	September 2020 to January 2021 staff taught a full curriculum. In January 2021 a second national lockdown was called which lasted until March 8 th 2021. During this time our curriculum was delivered remotely via Google classrooms.

Foundation subject assessment to be revised in light of any changes

Quizzes and low stakes ways of gathering evidence of what pupils have learnt to be devised (continue into 2021-2022)

When children returned to school we modified our curriculum review plans to reflect the needs of the pupils. Therefore some activities were carried over to the next academic year (see below)

Teachers used pre-teaching and pre-filling to support any lost learning (see also Catch-up plans). This enabled all pupils to have essential knowledge and skills needed for progression

New PSHE plans supported by Jigsaw were implemented across school. These allow for teaching about healthy and respectful relationships in modern society

Medium term plans produced and published for our 12 Topics in order to provide a sequential and coherent structure to learning.

Putting learning into context slides being used across school-"last time we learnt" and "coming next" slides thus allowing learning to be placed in context

Knowledge organisers for Geography, History and Science were produced and shared on the website and with children and parents in order





- Using the support of Squirrel Learning online safety SLA the planning for online safety to be fully revised across school
- Using the support of Squirrel learning Teaching and Learning SLA all computing units of work to be rewritten

INSET day on Curriculum "Ambition for all" to be held in June 2021 in line with LA SEND review

Assessment criteria in place for all Foundation subjects (except for Music). This allows for a common school approach to assessment and informs parents of how their child is achieving in all areas of school

Some low stakes quizzes devised in order to check up on knowledge gained and inform future planning

Online safety units of work all re-written in order to extend the learning in this area by making it a regular and integral part of our curriculum in order to keep children safe

SEND review took place June 2021. Action plan created and key points on new SIP in order to refine the provision for SEND pupils at Uplands

During Summer term 2021 all subject leaders carried out key monitoring activities following the lockdown to inform new school
