Total amount of PE and Sports Premium Received: £19,800

Key achievements to date until July 2020:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
 Health and well-being week was held at the end of spring term, in line with the children returning from another lockdown. Platinum Sports Games Mark achieved in 2019 through to 2022 (retained our award due to Covid-19). Every class received multiple Active Well-being Clubs through spring and summer term, after lockdown, ran by Soccer 2000 in their bubbles. PE equipment re-stocked Huff'n'Puff (playground play equipment) re-stocked and brand new equipment ordered. Some extra-curricular clubs have started in the Summer Term. 'Bush Tribe' club has been introduced linking with outdoor learning. Introduction of 'Trick Box' – mental health strategies for the children. Art of Brilliance focus week took place when children returned after lockdown in the spring. Principles were shared across all year groups. The new garden space, which will be used as a Mental Health space, has begun work. 	 Extra-curricular clubs to be put back onto the timetable according to DFE/LA guidance and covid-19 restrictions. Top-up swimming lessons for those children who missed their sessions last academic year and those in year 6 who need intervention to reach targets. Continue to provide CPD opportunities for staff. To further encourage less active and PP children to take part in extracurricular activities. To introduce Marathon Kids throughout the whole school (AW to implement) Develop 'Trick Box' further, embedding into school and considering a 'Trick Bob Team' with peer mentors. Art of Brilliance full website subscription to help with character development. Creative an outdoor space for positive mental health – garden. 'Bounce Together' – evaluate this resource for tracking mental health.


