

# UPLANDS JUNIOR SCHOOL School Uniform Policy May 2017



### **Principles**

It is our policy that all children should wear clothing that is in keeping with a purposeful learning ethos. We also believe it is important that certain activities are facilitated by specialised and appropriate clothing when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. We provide a complete list of the items needed for children's school uniform in this policy and in our school prospectus.

#### **Aims**

Our policy for children's school uniform is based on the belief that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school
- · engenders a feeling of community and belonging
- is practical and smart
- identifies the children with the school
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be)
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance (article 2 nondiscrimination)
- is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.

# Our colours are bottle green, grey and white and the uniform is as follows:

#### **Boys**

- School bottle green sweatshirt with or without school logo or
- School bottle green jumper with or without school logo
- School white polo shirt with or without school logo or
- White or grey shirt
- School bottle green book bag with school logo (Optional)
- Grey trousers or grey shorts
- School tie

# Girls

- School bottle green sweatshirt or jumper with or without school logo or
- School bottle green cardigan with or without school logo
- School white polo shirt with school logo or white blouse
- School bottle green book bag with school logo (Optional)
- Grey skirt, grey or black trousers or grey pinafore dress
- Green gingham/striped dresses may be worn in the summer term
- School tie

## For PE all children need

- School t-shirt In red, green, yellow or blue depending on House
- School black gym bag
- School navy PE shorts
- A pair of pumps

All clothing and footwear should be clearly labelled with your child's name
