Healthy Minds

We continue our work on developing a whole school culture that considers the well-being of all pupils, staff and the school community. As part of this Year 5 worked with The Art of Brilliance to introduce a well being curriculum into our school with an aim of leaving a sustainable, long term well-being ethos. Unicef clean air campaign

According to UNICEF, we have medium levels of air pollution compared to other schools in the campaign. The ambassadors encouraged pupils to make at least 1 air pollution pledge. The top 5 pledges were:

- Turn off the car engine whilst waiting (Waiting for 2 mins is equivalent to 2 miles of driving)
- Plant trees or shrubs in the garden
- Walk or cycle instead of using a car
- Only use a car for long journeys
- Turn off lights and appliances when not in use

The ambassadors have been making signs for our new classroom plants, some of which have been kindly donated by pupils. Every classroom now has at least one plant which will help to improve our air quality. We have also had some outdoor plants, bulbs and seeds donated. Many thanks for all of these; we can't wait to get planting!
