School trips and visits

Please find below some helpful information re school trips that I have recently been asked about.

Questions and Answers

Q. Why do parents have to pay for trips and workshops?

School receives no direct funding for trips and workshops and relies totally on the voluntary contributions made by parents. If there are not enough contributions to cover the cost of a visit/workshop then the money either has to be paid from the school finance pot reserved for pupil resources or the trip may have to be cancelled. You will have seen in the press that school budgets are becoming even tighter and more difficult to balance.

Q. Does the cost that a parent pays cover the shortfall for any non-paying pupils?

No. On the letter that goes home there is always a breakdown included to show how the cost of the trip has been calculated. This is calculated from entrance fees and coach costs and divided by the number of pupils in a year group. A parent only ever pays for the cost of their own child and never towards that of another.

Q. My child receives free school meals. Does this entitle me to any discount?

Yes it does. If you register for FSM then school receives some funding that goes towards the cost of a visit and also contributes significantly to the cost of the Yr6 residential.

O. My child would be eligible for FSM but wants to bring a packed lunch?

It is still worth you registering your child for FSM so that school can get the funding that will help with a trip and residential cost. We get a list of all the pupils whom we have received funding for.

We are grateful for all the contributions that come in towards visits and workshops. When I first became Headteacher at Uplands parents/carers asked via the parent questionnaire if more visits could be arranged and we addressed this. We aim to find experiences that will enhance learning and topic work but sadly there is nothing in budgets that allows us to fund these. I'm sure you would agree that it would be a real shame if trips had to go from the curriculum.




Term time holidays

I have been asked by the Local Authority to inform you of changes to the rules regarding term time holidays which will come into effect from 1st September 2017. This is due to the Isle of Wight case that went to the High court. All term time holiday requests will be "unauthorised" irrespective of attendance levels unless there are exceptional circumstances. Requests of 5 days or more will incur a penalty notice from the LA. All requests for leave must be completed on the correct form which is available from the school office.

In addition from September the Local Authority Educational Welfare Officers will be monitoring any **attendance that falls below 95%**. Medical evidence is required to be shown for any GP and dental appointments etc.
